Tickets will be on sale beginning February 12th and can be purchased from a Miss or Mr. HHS contestant, online, or at the door.

#### **Contestant Guidelines**

- 1. Contestants must be a Heritage High School student for the 2023-2024 school year.
- 2. Contestants must submit a completed application, application fee, teacher recommendation, and parental consent form by January 19, 2024. Late applications will not be accepted.
- 3. Contestants must have at least a 3.0 overall GPA (weighted) and currently be in good academic standing in all classes. Guidance counselor and teacher signatures are required.
- 4. Contestants should not have any disciplinary offenses (ISS or OSS) for the 2023-2024 school year. Administrator approval is required. If an incident occurs after we receive your application and application fee, you will be disqualified. During the pageant process or upon winning the title the winner(s) may be dismissed or stripped of his or her title for failure to comply with school rules in conjecture with misrepresenting Heritage High School. **No refund will be given.**
- 5. Contestants will have to pay an application fee of \$100.00.
- 6. Contestants that are pregnant will not be allowed to compete. No refund will be given.
- 7. Contestants should not hold any other pageant titles that would prevent him/her from completing their duties as Miss & Mr. Heritage High School.
- 8. Contestants must be able and willing to attend ALL practices, appearances, photoshoot, and meetings. If you must be absent from practice due to illness or other approved absence, it must be discussed with Mrs. Morton, Mrs. McTier, or Mr. Powell-Harris in advance. One excused absence is allowed. Contestants who miss practice in excess or without prior approval will be disqualified from winning Miss or Mr. HHS; however, contestants will still be eligible for other prizes. The photoshoot, rehearsals the week of the pageant, especially dress rehearsal, are mandatory.
- 9. Contestants must participate in the pageant community service projects. Contestants will receive documentation of their participation as evidence of community service hours earned.
- 10. Contestants must sell sponsorships for the pageant program. Each contestant is required to sell a minimum of \$300.00 worth of ads for the program and a minimum of (20) tickets to the event.
- 11. Contestants should always show good sportsmanship and S.E.T the stage by being exemplary representatives of Heritage High School. Contestants showing less than sportsman-like conduct will be disqualified from the pageant.
  - 12. Contestants will display creativity by decorating a shoe-sized box for the People's Choice Award.

    Boxes must be decorated and turned in by dress rehearsal (March 25, 2024).

**Areas of Competition** 

<u>Fundraising</u> (25% of total score)- Each contestant will participate in fundraising by selling a minimum of 15 calendars, 20 tickets, and a minimum of \$300.00 worth of ads for the program.

<u>Personal Interview</u> (20% of total score) – Each contestant will participate in an individual five (5) minute interview. There are typically 5 judges on the panel. Contestants are questioned on their background as presented on their resume', their educational and career goals, their opinions on current events and social issues, and their interests, hobbies and extracurricular activities. Scoring is based on overall first impression, validated opinions and responses in context, poise, personal appearance and attractiveness, personality, intelligence, style, emotional control, speech, vocabulary, grammar, ability to have a confident and commanding presence; knowledge, understanding, and ability to articulate her opinions, sense of accomplishment. No political or controversial questions will be asked.

<u>Casual/Spirit Wear</u> (10% of total score) – Each contestant appears on stage in an outfit of their choice. Contestants are encouraged to wear school colors (Red, White, Royal Blue.) Scoring is based on overall appearance, creativity, sense of style, charisma and expressions, sense of confidence and composure.

Evening Wear (15% of total score) – Each contestant appears on stage in an outfit of her own choosing, representative of what he/she would wear to a formal social event. Evening gowns and tuxedos are appropriate for this phase of the competition. Scoring is based on overall first impression, sense of confidence, personality and stage presence, walk and posture, carriage and grace, appropriateness of attire, sense of style, sense of attractiveness, beauty, and charm.

## The top 10 (based on fundraising, personal interview, casual/spirit wear, and evening wear)

<u>Talent</u> (15% of total score) – Contestants perform a 2-minute routine of his/her choosing. Some possible talents include all types of singing, dancing, gymnastics, instrumental music, dramatic or comedy monologues, baton twirling and ventriloquism, recitation of a poem. Other talents that can be performed solo on a stage are also possible. Scoring is based on contestant's talent selection and performance as it distinguishes his/her personality, interpretive ability, technical skill level (execution, technique, and control), stage presence and the totality of all elements (including costume, props, voice, use of body, and choreography).

#### The top 5 (based 0n scores from the top 10 and the addition of the talent score)

<u>The On-Stage Question (15% of total score)</u> – The final phase of competition is comprised of questions of a general nature and will not be something taken from the private interview. The objective is to evaluate the contestant's ability to think on his/her feet and answer a question of general interest to people his/her age, including but not limited to local, state, and national current events. Scoring is based on overall first impression and the judges should ask themselves:

- 1) Did the contestant answer the question in the context in which it was asked?
- 2) Can he/she handle the pressure of speaking on stage in front of an audience?
- 3) Will young people see his/her as a role model who is reflective of today's generation?

<u>Final Ballot</u> - From the above 100%, the Top Five Finalists will be named. The Top Five Finalists enter the final round of competition with zero points. The judges will then rank the contestants in the order they individually believe the contestants should finish based on the overall impression they have of each of the finalists. Each judge will rank the Top Five contestants on a Final Ballot. A first-place vote is worth ten points, a second-place vote is worth five points, a third-place vote is worth three points, a fourth-place vote is worth two points and a fifth-place vote is worth one point. The total of the Final Ballots alone will determine the outcome of the pageant. The high and low scores on the Final Ballot will NOT be dropped. All judges' votes count on the Final Ballot.

You can use photos, 3-D displays, fabric, rhinestones, words, and stickers to **express who you are!** There is no right or wrong way to decorate. You are campaigning for the audience's vote so be creative and have FUN!

Be sure your **name is on the box** where it can be easily read. Also, please do not obstruct the openings on the box in any way.

Contestants will turn in their People's Choice Box the night of the final stage rehearsal.

Be sure to pick up your box at the end of the pageant. We will not be responsible for any boxes left at the school after the pageant is over. Any boxes left at the school will be discarded.
