Heritage High School serves students who are residents of Elk's Aidmore Children's Center. Elk's Aidmore provides residential care 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Students must attend public school. Heritage High School serves these students during our regular school year and during summer tutorials. It is our intention to provide support to ensure academic success for all students. The staff at Elk's Aidmore Children's Center, acting as parents to the resident students, are included in all correspondence and Parent Engagement activities.
